

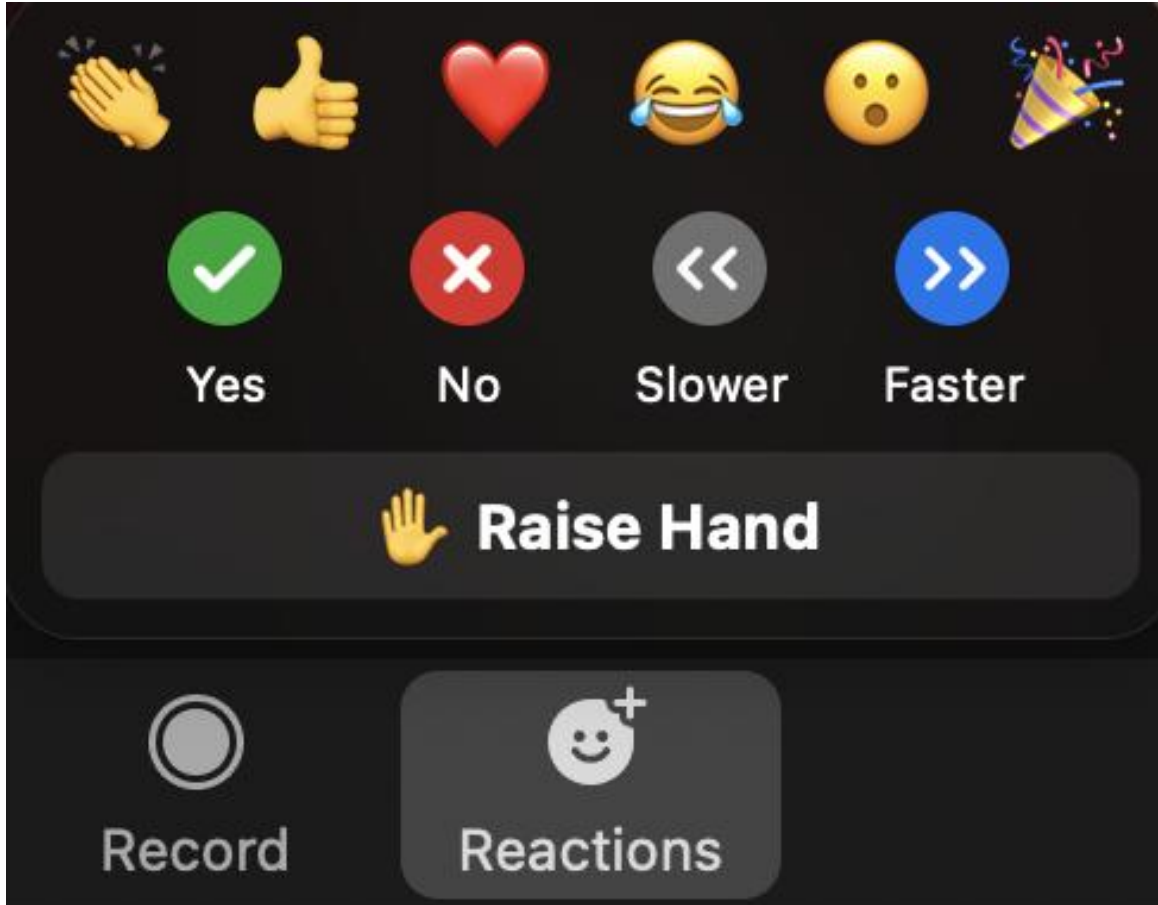

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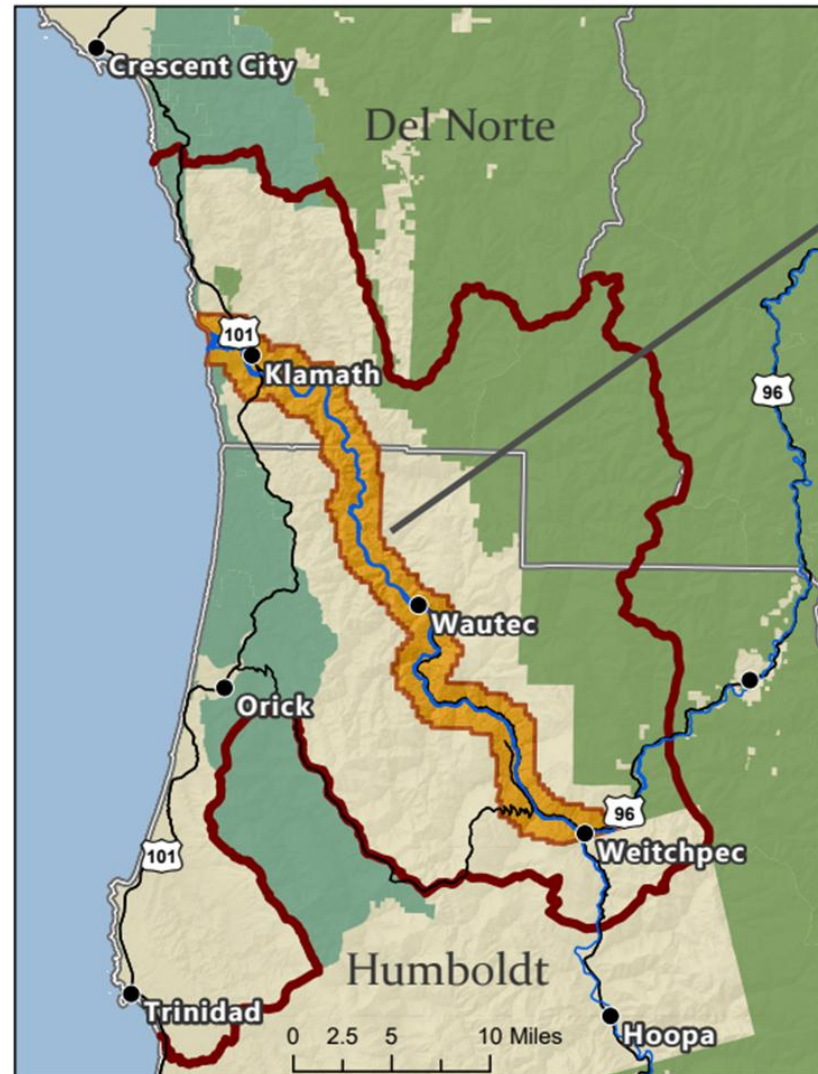

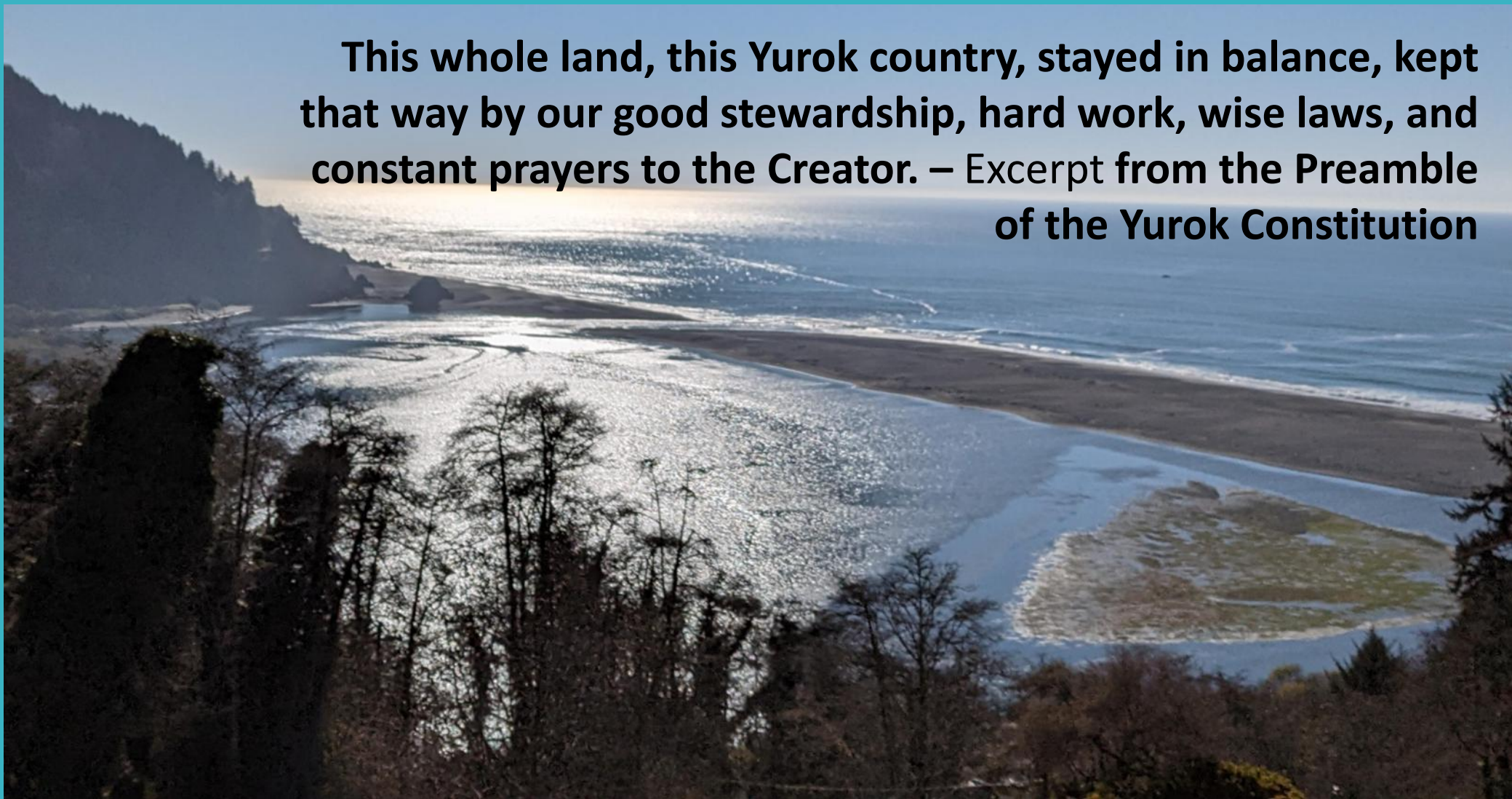

Yurok Child Support Services



- 2014 comprehensive IV-D child support program after 2 years of start-up planning grant
- 2014 Child Support Services Agreement with California Department of Child Support Services signed
- 2014 California Court Rule 5.372 first made to outline transfer of state cases to tribal courts.
 - Amended in 2018

Yurok Child Support Services Numbers 2025



- Cases open: 125
- Number of children served: 139
- Staff Members – Case Technician, Case Specialist, Accounts Specialist, Program Manager; fund Court Clerk, part time Tribal Attorney and contract Chief Judge.
- Location of our office(s): Eureka, CA off reservation service area (3 staff); Weitchpec, CA – upper reservation (program manager); Klamath, CA Yurok Justice Center - lower reservation (tribal attorney, judge, court clerk).
 - Drive between each location is roughly 1.5 hours ranging from 5 ft. above sea level to 3,000 ft. above sea level.

ABOUT NEVADA CHILD SUPPORT

- Utilizes both State offices and County offices
- Larger areas (Clark and Washoe) are team based
- Smaller offices- cradle to grave including working intergovernmental cases
- 17 counties in Nevada, 11 child support offices plus Central Office and SCaDU
- Elko County DA office has approximately 1200 cases split between 4 workers and Program Manager



About Elko County and our office

- Elko County has population of approximately 55,000 in the entire county.
- Lander County has a population of about 5,700
- Elko County has 3 border “towns”-Owyhee, Jackpot, Wendover
- There are 4 incorporated cities in Elko County-Elko, Carlin, Wells and West Wendover
- We work cradle to grave
- All types of case-establishment, enforcement, initiating referrals, responding referrals
- Our office does not handle any Nevada TANF cases

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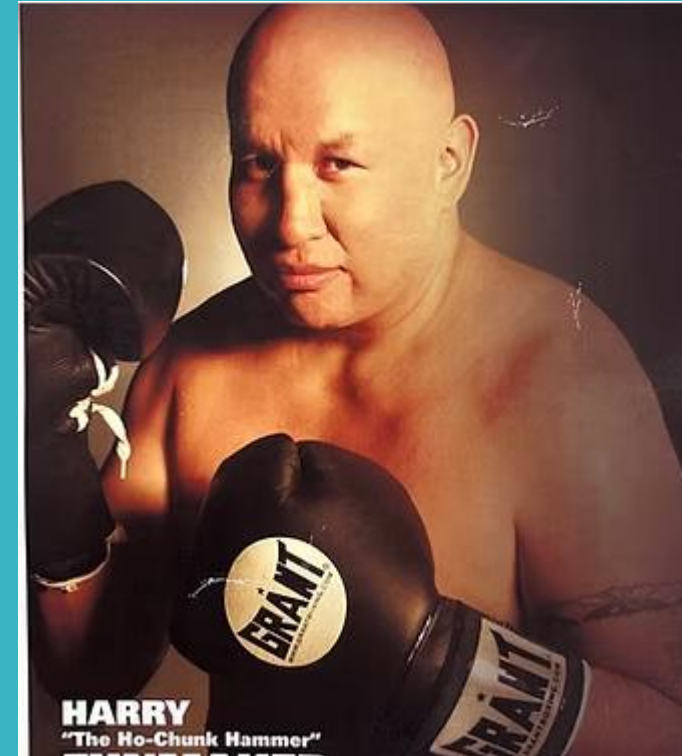

Ho-Chunk Nation

- The Ho-Chunk Nation does not have a reservation. We have trust land. We have members located in 48 States and territories and 30 members located in International areas.
- The largest population of Ho-Chunk members is in Wisconsin with 5,345 members.
- The Ho-Chunk Nation operates 6 casinos, 3 hotels and 5 convenience stores, all located in Wisconsin.
- The Ho-Chunk Nation is comprised of four branches of government: Executive, Legislative, Judicial and General Council.

Ho-Chunk Nation

- Total Enrollment as of April 2025 is 7,758
 - Adults – 6,416
 - Children - 1,342
- Total Cases in the HCN Child Support Agency as of September 30, 2025.
 - Domestic – 500 cases
 - Foreign – 296 cases



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Ho-Chunk Nation Child Support Agency

- Became comprehensive May 19, 2014.
- We are a small agency with seven total employees: Director, Attorney, Clerk, Technical Supervisor and three Specialist (Financial, Domestic, Foreign).
- Our Agency handles domestic cases judicially.
- Foreign cases are handled administratively. This is a recent change, (March 18, 2025). Prior to this, all foreign cases were handled judicially.



Ho-Chunk Nation Personal Jurisdiction

- Members of the Ho-Chunk Nation, or individuals who are eligible to become a member but are not enrolled as a member.
- Individuals who are the biological parent or adoptive parent of a child that is an enrolled member or eligible to be an enrolled member with the HCN.
- Individuals who consent to the jurisdiction of the agency or the court by participating in the proceeding, unless participating is for the purpose of contesting jurisdiction.



Ho-Chunk Nation Jurisdiction continued

- Individuals who reside on Ho-Chunk Nation lands with a child who is enrolled or eligible to be enrolled with the Ho-Chunk Nation.
- Individuals employed by the Ho-Chunk Nation for the sole purpose of registering and enforcing Income Withholding Orders (IWO) of foreign jurisdictions.

Per Capita –vs- General Welfare

■ Per Capita

- The Ho-Chunk Nation issued per-capita payments in the amount of \$1,000 per month.
- Every tribal member received this payment. The payment for minors was put into a trust until the child was 18, graduated and completed financial literacy or 25 years of age.
- Per Capita payments could be used as gross income when calculating child support obligations.
- Child Support can be garnished from per capita by having your foreign order registered with the Ho-Chunk Nation for enforcement.
- The last per capita payment was issued May 1, 2020.



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Per Capita –vs- General Welfare

■ General Welfare:

- The Ho-Chunk Nation issues a general welfare payment of \$1,000 per month to every enrolled member.
- The payment for minors is put into the trust.
- This is not considered income and cannot be used when calculating child support.
- The general welfare code allows for the Ho-Chunk Nation to garnish the general welfare payments for child support up to 40% for current support and 20% for arrears.
- The state of Wisconsin allows “Garnishment of Income” therefore, they cannot garnish the general welfare payments, as they are not considered income.
- The Ho-Chunk Nation can garnish non-income.

Case Jurisdictional Transfer

- Existing court cases within the state of Wisconsin can be transferred to the Ho-Chunk Nation if we have jurisdiction under Wisconsin Statute 801.54 discretionary transfer.



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Case Transfer Process

- A case is identified as eligible for a case transfer.
- The Ho-Chunk Nation will send a letter to both parties advising them that their case has been identified as a possible case transfer.
- If the HCN CSA receives no response, then the case information is sent to the County Agency.
- The county agency will send out a letter to all parties including the HCN CSA advising that they have 10 days to object to a case transfer.
 - If they object – a hearing is scheduled in the County Court.
 - If they do not object the case will proceed with the transfer.



Case Transfer Process continued

- The HCN CSA will file a motion in HCN Trial Court for conditional acceptance of transfer, using the counties letter as evidence. This is mailed to all parties.
- If anyone objects to the transfer, a hearing in HCN Trial Court will be scheduled.
- If no one objects to the motion, the Court will issue an order for Conditional Acceptance of Transfer.
- This order is mailed to all of the parties including the county agency.



Case Transfer Process continued.

- Upon receipt of the Order Conditional Acceptance of Transfer, the County will file an Order for Transfer. This will be mailed to all parties.
- Upon receipt of the Order for Transfer from the County the HCN CSA will file a motion to accept transfer using the counties Order as evidence. This is mailed to all parties.
- If there is no objection, the HCN Trial Court will issue the Order Accepting Transfer.



Process to register a Foreign court order for Enforcement.

- If a person is employed with the Ho-Chunk Nation, you can register your court order with the HCN for enforcement.
- Documents needed:
 - Transmittal #1 (Initial Request)
 - Confidential Addendum
 - Authenticated Court Order from foreign jurisdiction.
 - IWO that matches the court order.
 - Authenticated payment account statement or Affidavit of Arrears signed and notarized.



Process to register a foreign court order.

- The HCN CSA will send out a letter of responsibility to the paying parent advising that we received a foreign court order for enforcement.
- If no one objects within 10 days, a HCN IWO is sent to treasury for enforcement. A copy of the HCN IWO is also sent to the foreign jurisdiction.
- If a person objects to the registration of the foreign court order, the CS specialist will meet with the parties to discuss their objection.
- If an understanding and/or agreement cannot be reached the Specialist will file a petition with the HCN Trial Court to allow the person to have an objection hearing.

New Mexico Received the 2024 Program Awareness Award from the National Child Support Engagement Association

- 2013 - 2021 - **E-Filing** and electronic filings with the Courts
- 2019 - **Supporting, Training, and Employing Parents Up (STEPUp!)** Pilot Began
 - Job Development and Job Opportunities for unemployed and underemployed non-custodial parents (NCPs)
- 2020 - **Online and Phone Payment** Options since 2020
- 2021 - **Child support guidelines** that reflect:
 - actual income,
 - ability to pay, and
 - reduced “look-back period” to 3 years
- 2022 – **Eliminated** \$5 monthly cash medical support for children on Medicaid
- 2023 - **Families First Distribution Changes**
 - Current TANF assistance **pass through of \$100 for 1 child or \$200 for 2 or more children**

 - Locate parents
 - Establish parentage
 - Establish and modify orders through Tribal courts
 - Enforce court orders, collect and distribute payments
 - *Parties must apply for services

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BRIEF HISTORY

- In the 1750s, to relieve crowding at Kahnawake and move closer to the Iroquois homeland, the French established a mission at the present site on the St. Lawrence River. The Mohawk people had continually used this area at the confluence of the St. Lawrence River Valley as one of our fishing and hunting grounds prior to the building of the first church. “Akwesasne” as it is known today, translates roughly to “Land where the partridge drink” and has always been a prime location due to the confluence of several small rivers and the St. Lawrence River.

LOCATION



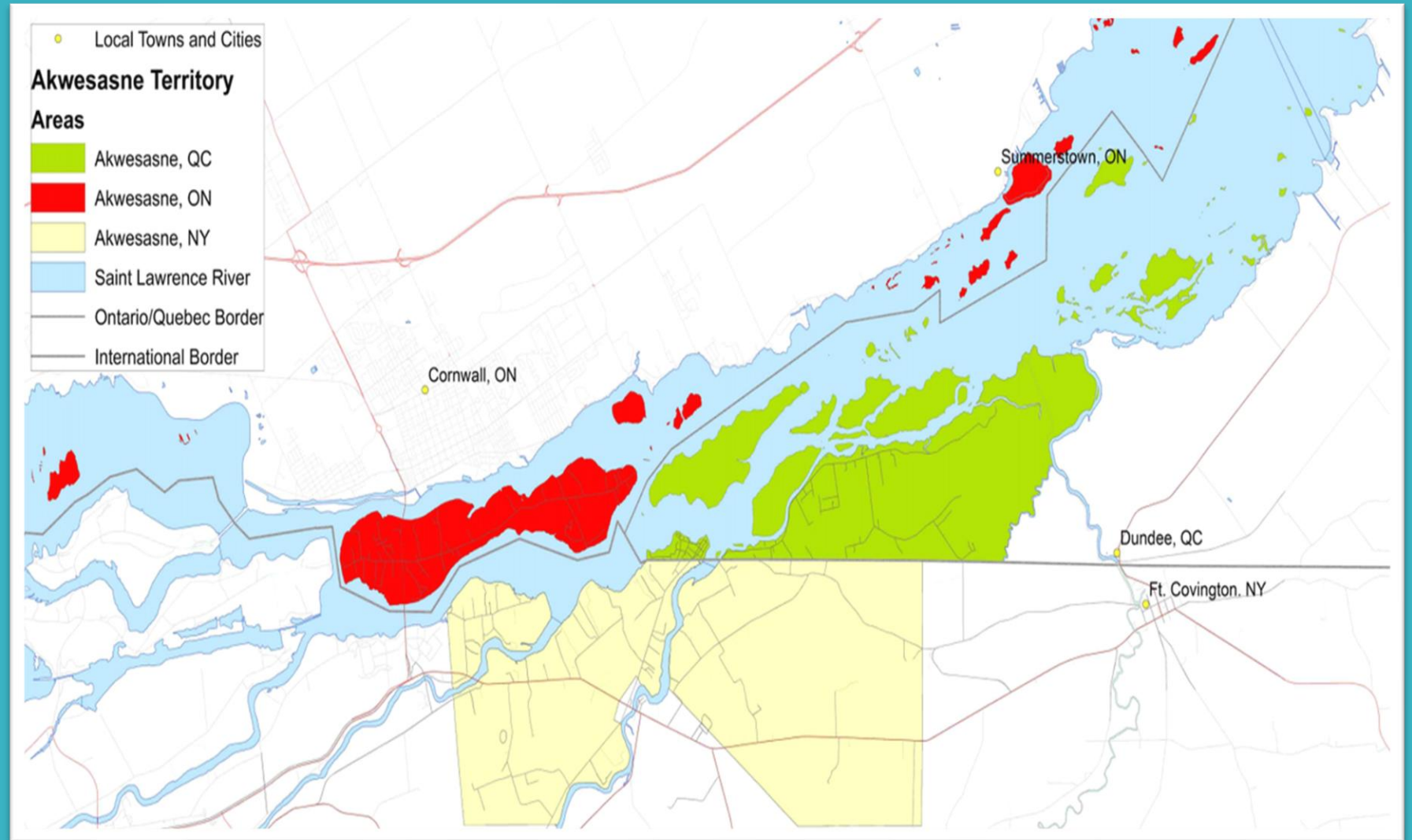
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- Current land base is 21 square miles and 281 acres in trust lands.

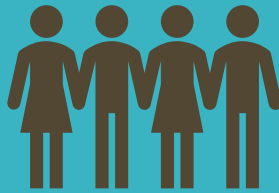
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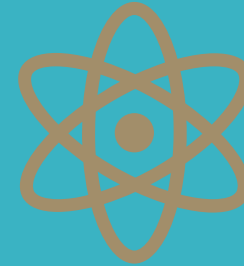

■ Administrative Process



Expedited Procedure: The Navajo Nation utilizes expedited administrative processes. It grants the department authority to order DNA genetic testing; subpoena information from employers; order income withholding; intercept lump-sum payments; state and federal tax refunds; Indian gaming and lottery winnings; and increase monthly support obligations to collect arrearages, without judicial or administrative approval.

Procedural Protections: Child Support Act reinforces measures to ensure that the procedures meet the timeframes and protect the due process rights of the individuals involved.

Due Process Requirements: Navajo Nation has established criteria for due process in three general areas: Right to notice, Right to a hearing, and Right to judicial review of administrative action.

Legal Documents: The Administrative process require the department to notify the NCP of person filing against them, claiming paternity and the amount of child support obligation being claimed and the procedure for contesting the claim. Legally sufficient notice and service requirements are stipulated in the Child Support Act.

Legal Procedure: Notice of Public Assignment-Applicant will sign to the department all rights he or she may have; Service of Process; Request for Administrative Hearing.

Enforcement



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- Regulations require careful monitoring of all department services including enforcement remedies:
 - ❖ Income Withholding order
 - ❖ License Suspension
 - ❖ Income Tax interception
 - ❖ Passport Denial
 - ❖ Bank Account Seizures

Orders from outside Navajo Nation



A foreign order from another child support program that received IV-D (Child Support) funds is entitled to Full Faith & Credit so long as basic due process was afforded in the originating jurisdiction. In essence, the order becomes a NN order and is enforced.

If an order from a non-IV-D program is presented for enforcement, common law comity is used on a case-by-case basis.

Penobscot Nation

- The Penobscot Nation is one of the five tribes in Maine. There are the Passamaquoddy Tribes that have two reservations and a joint council. The Houlton Band of Maliseets and the Micmac tribe. Both of those reservations are located in northern Maine.
- The Penobscot Nation is located on the river near Old Town Maine.
- There are 2,341 tribal members as of January 2025



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Mount Katahdin



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PNCSA

- The Penobscot Nation Child Support Agency has been comprehensive since 2008.
- We have a very small case load
- Employees are the Social Services Director, PNCSA Program Coordinator, Case aid/Administrative Coordinator, Wabanaki Child Support Case Manager and the Social Services Business Manager



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- The most exciting thing that has just happened for the Penobscot Nation Child Support program is the creation of the Wabanaki Child Support Consortium.
- PNCSA first started thinking about a consortium in 2018
- COVID hit and that stopped the expansion
- After COVID, the tribe was able to connect with the Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians
- After A LOT of work and A LOT of meetings, PNCSA was notified that their budget amendment was approved



- The notice of award was April 21, 2025
- We had challenges getting a qualified employee, but we do have one now
- We opened our doors for business November 1, 2025!

MY PLEDGE

Whereas child support professionals have a common purpose and mission: to enhance the well-being of children;

Whereas child support professionals across the nation already manage a large volume of cases, and must rely on their counterparts in other child support agencies to forward appropriate and complete Interjurisdictional cases;

Whereas we recognize that one strategy to help us achieve our mission is to optimize cooperation and eliminate barriers associated with multijurisdictional cases:

I Pledge:

- To communicate timely, and professionally with my colleagues in other jurisdictions by:
 - Returning phone calls and emails promptly.
 - Using CSENet whenever possible.
 - Leaving clear and concise messages when calling or emailing my fellow child support professionals.
 - My messages will include my name; return direct phone number (as agency policy permits) and relevant case information: names of parties; initiating and responding jurisdiction case numbers; and a description of the information I am requesting or providing.
 - Providing requested information that is timely and complete.
 - Explaining my rationale for undertaking a certain course of action, when asked.
 - Sending correspondence that is clear and concise:
 - I will avoid acronyms and agency specific terms.
 - I will make sure that all hand written information is legible, and include my name and contact information on all correspondence.
 - I will ensure that my requests for information are reasonable and allow sufficient time for the other caseworker to respond.
 -
- If I am the child support professional in the initiating jurisdiction, I am responsible and accountable for communicating with the case applicant. I will not advise the applicant to contact the responding jurisdiction, pass on the responding case manager's email address or phone numbers, nor will I disparage the handling of the case by the other jurisdiction. I will provide the responding jurisdiction with all information necessary for the referral, including a verified address to facilitate case processing.
- If I am the child support professional in the responding jurisdiction, I am responsible and accountable for communicating with the party living in my jurisdiction. I am responsible for working the responding case to the same extent I would work a case within my own jurisdiction. I will timely provide the initiating jurisdiction status information that is requested. I will not disparage the handling of the case by the other jurisdiction.
- To work with other child support professionals in a cooperative manner that best serves our common goal by taking the "extra" step that will make a positive difference in the case.
